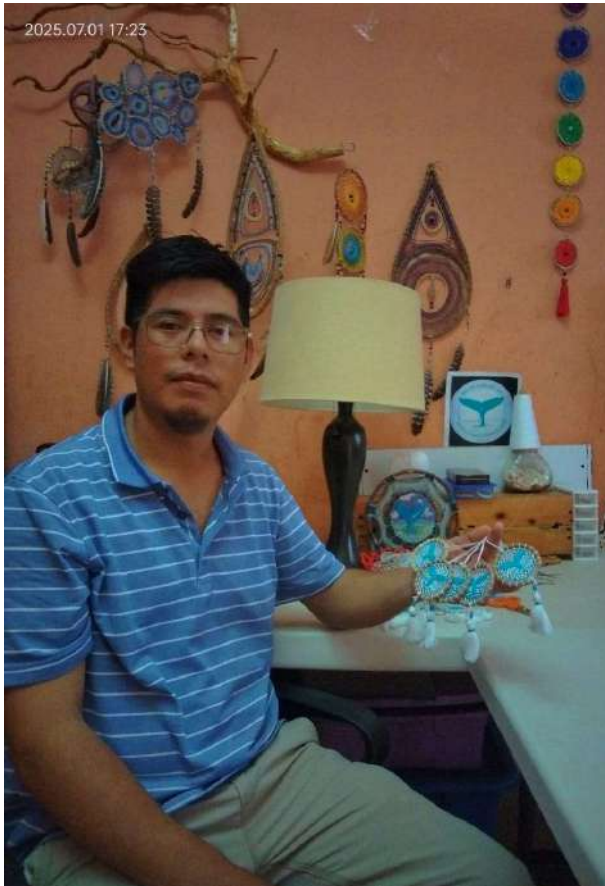

**Artisan: Octavio Gómez López.** Originally from San Cristóbal de las Casas, Chiapas, Octavio has lived in Bahía de Banderas since he was 14 years old. He speaks the Indigenous Tzotzil language and comes from a family of artisans—his mother and sisters handcraft embroidered blouses, bracelets, and belts.



For the past eight years, Octavio has been dedicated to making dreamcatchers. In his **whale tail dreamcatchers**, he uses cotton thread, vine hoops, and recycled glass beads ♻️. He also incorporates natural stones such as quartz and agates. See image in the souvenirs section.
